<p>New South Wales</p> <p>http://www.olgr.nsw.gov.au/olgr_default.asp</p>	<p>Online RSA training is NOT accepted in New South Wales venues.</p> <p>A Liquor Administration Board (LAB) approved certificate is the only one accepted in NSW.</p> <p>For class details go to: www.cftnsw.com.au or call 1300 661 205</p>
<p>Victoria</p> <p>http://www.consumer.vic.gov.au</p>	<p>The Nationally Recognised Certificate is suitable for all staff working in the hospitality industry.</p> <p>Nationally-recognised RSA online training is suitable for many staff working in the hospitality industry. Nationally-recognised RSA online training is NOT accepted in Victoria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • for licensees or staff working with packaged liquor in bottle shops and supermarkets; • where it is a condition of the licensee's liquor license that all staff must complete an RSA course (with a certificate signed by the Director of Liquor Licensing Victoria); and • in venues that are open after 1 am and have amplified music. <p>The LLV certificate is available through in-class training only. <p>Queensland</p> <p>http://www.olgr.qld.gov.au/</p>	<p>Queensland OLGR has reviewed all RSA training and as from January 1, 2009 the Regulations are:</p> <p>All new staff employed after 1 January 2009 working in the liquor industry require a current OLGR certificate in RSA within 30 days of starting employment. RMLV staff also require an OLGR approved RSA certificate. (CFT offer this online or face-to-face classes).</p> <p>Staff who have a nationally approved or other State or Territory RSA certificate can undertake the OLGR approved RSA Bridging Course. If you were employed prior to 1/1/09 and are still with the same employer you have until 30/6/10 to gain an OLGR approved RSA certificate. (see CFT Bridging course online) If you hold a Qld Liquor Licensing certificate and need to renew it, you must undertake the full OLGR RSA Training course, NOT the bridging course-there are no refresher courses approved in Qld.</p> <p>RSA training for volunteers will not be mandatory provided they are supervised by an RSA-trained individual. A licensee or permittee must take reasonable steps to ensure that this</p>

	<p>supervision is provided.</p> <p>OLGR RSA Online you get 2 certificates OLGR RSA training course certificate and national RSA certificate for those who travel. CFT also offers a separate national unit RSA course online and by correspondence that is suitable for participants in NT, WA, SA & VIC except (read above under Victoria). Go to www.cft.com.au It is NOT suitable for RMLV or Qld staff. (read each state requirement)</p> <p>(CFT offer OLGR RSA & RMLV training in classes -phone 1300 665 633 to book).
